Has your child missed a vaccine?

Catching up is easy. You probably won't need to start your child's series over; schedule an appointment with your healthcare provider to get caught up.

Why do babies and children need more vaccines nowadays?

When a baby is born, they are vulnerable to serious illnesses like whooping cough. Vaccines protect children against preventable diseases. This helps keep children healthier and saves many lives compared to many years ago.

Do vaccines have any side effects?

Side effects are generally mild and temporary, including crying, fever, and minor discomfort. Rest assured; the vaccines used in Canada are rigorously tested and safe. These vaccines are your tools for ensuring the health and well-being of your loved ones.

Who should not receive the vaccine?

Children may not be able to get a vaccine if:

- They have an allergy to any part of the vaccine
- They had a severe or unusual side effect after getting this vaccine or a similar vaccine. Most children are eligible for these vaccines in Alberta.

Is it okay to choose which vaccines my child gets?

It's not a good idea to skip vaccines. Vaccines prevent serious and sometimes deadly diseases, and without them, your child could be at risk.
