ALTERNATIVE CAREER PATHWAYS FOR INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL GRADUATES (ACPS FOR IMGS)

What do we mean by an alternative career?

Alternative careers for IMGs are non-physician, health and wellness jobs that utilize IMGs' medical knowledge and skills.

What we know?

Alternative careers are often sought by IMGs in Canada as a stepping-stone in their pursuit of licensure as a means to familiarize themselves with the Canadian healthcare system. For others, an alternative career is a long-term, permanent career change and a way to regain professional identity if pursuing licensure is unattainable or undesired.

What is AIMGA doing in this area?

AIMGA has been pursuing viable alternative career pathways for IMGs for the past 3 years.

"We have helped many IMGs obtain licensure and we will continue to do so; however, not all IMGs will meet with success or wish to pursue licensure. Therefore, I wanted to know what other career opportunities are available to our members. This led us to the realization that there is a lack of information for IMGs wishing to pursue alternative careers. Our team has been steadily working to develop resources and programming based on the research we have conducted." Deidre Lake

AIMGA has been conducting research in collaboration with the University of Calgary and has published two research articles and a book chapter. The team has also conducted a national survey with over 1,700 IMGs in order to understand the proportion of IMGs interested in alternative careers, their socio-demography, and the reasons behind opting for an alternative career.

We conducted eight focus groups with IMG participants from across Canada. The findings of this study are helping us to ensure appropriate guidance, skill-building, and supports for the decision-making process and identification of the most suitable careers.

AIMGA's Resources/ Fact Sheets

Apart from identifying around 200 potential alternative jobs for IMGs, we have been developing factsheets for each of these jobs. We have already published 55 job factsheets on our <u>website</u>. (See figure 1)

The factsheets contain a general overview, job responsibilities, and qualification requirements. In addition, they contain information on demand based on the current job market, wages/salary, growth, training options, and other details. These fact sheets will not only provide information on potential alternative jobs for IMGs but also help them make informed decisions about their careers.

Mitac's Accelerate Internship Program

AIMGA in partnership with the University of Calgary secured a competitive grant through Mitac's Accelerate Internship Program which is an initiative supported by ScotiaBank. Only 20% of the total submissions were successful and our project was the only one selected for Alberta.

The 6-month long project (June to November 2021) provides us an opportunity to expand upon our work on alternative careers for IMGs. More information will follow.



Mr. Saif Sikdar, a PhD level graduate student at the University of Calgary, will be leading this initiative as the designated intern for this project under the supervision of Dr. Turin Tanvir Chowdhury and Deidre Lake. Apart from this project, Saif has received several scholarships in his academic career and has developed an interest in the area of alternative career pathways for IMGs. He also has an interest in organizing knowledge mobilization and community engagement programs as the president of the Bangladeshi Scholars' Association at the University of Calgary. AIMGA'S SUCCESS IN THE PAST YEAR

Career Transition Program

We have successfully completed cohort 7 of our Career Transition Program (CTP). The Career Transition Program for IMGs has consistently proved to have a positive impact on the participants' pursuit of careers. This program has resulted in economic growth for some, regaining professional identity, achieving alternative career goals, and capacity building for AIMGA. Due to COVID-19 our program delivery had to move online from the middle of cohort 5, however, this opened up the opportunity to help IMGs outside of Alberta. We now have participants joining from Saskatchewan, British Columbia, Manitoba, and Ontario.




Figure 2. Snapshot of the CTP program






Figure 3. AIMGP overall success rate and the percentage of AIMGA member. in AIMGP residency seats Figure 4. Overall success rate of AIMGA members who participated in CaRMs preparation programs/ services and matched to residency Out of 42 candidates who secured residency, fourteen (33.33%) matched in Alberta, fifteen (35.71%) in Ontario, three (7.14%) in Manitoba, two (4.76%) in Saskatchewan, one (2.38%) in Quebec, and six (14.29%) in the USA.

Health Matters! Wellness Matters! Diversity Matters!

AIMGA has been busy creating opportunities for our members to support throughout the pandemic. In March 2020, we created a COVID Response Team which has turned into a Health and Wellness Team. We launched our HealthHub for Newcomers in the beginning of 2021 and have been busy supporting community members, community partners, and Alberta Health Services. In December 2020, the Calgary East-zone Newcomer Collaborative (CENC) was formed which AIMGA belonged. We were part of the AHS community taskforce to provide supports to employees of meatpacking plants in Calgary and surrounding areas when outbreaks occurred. We later supported AHS and the Mosaic PCN during vaccine clinics at these sites. Through CENC, we worked closely with The Immigrant Education Society (TIES) and ActionDignity to support the collaborative. We conducted follow up surveys with recipients of services and supports. We've also been supporting refugee clients of the Calgary Catholic Immigration Society (CCIS) to address vaccine hesitancy and to increase vaccine uptake. We are working closely with the Mosaic Primary Care Network and Alberta Health Services to offer educational supports and community townhalls in various languages. Most recently, we've been working with the Centre for Newcomers (CFN) to support community, walk-in, vaccine clinics.



Funding: Immunization Partnership Fund – Public Health Agency of Canada

AIMGA has been awarded funding from the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) through the Immunization Partnership Fund (IPF). Partners and supporters include: Calgary East Zone Newcomers Collaborative (CENC), Alberta Health Services (AHS), Mosaic Primary Care Network, City of Calgary, COVID-19 pandemic Response and Impact Grant for Quality Improvement (CORIG-QI), Calgary Catholic Immigration Society (CCIS), 19 To Zero, Edmonton COVID-19 Rapid Response Collaborative (ECRRC), and the University of Calgary.

Project Name: Improving COVID-19 Vaccine Literacy and Acceptancy among newcomers

Description: This project will offer tailored interventions to increase vaccine literacy and improve underserved newcomers to Alberta access to vaccination. Interventions will include practical aids such as booking vaccine appointments, providing appointment reminders, and providing transportation and accompaniment to and from vaccine appointments. The project will also create multi-lingual educational supports such as community-based forums, videomediated resources, podcasts, campaign drives, pop-up events, workplace educational sessions, and presentations to those enrolled in language instruction classes.

Timeframe: June 1st, 2021 to May 31st, 2022.

As part of this initiative, AIMGA has been working with community partners to conduct educational sessions in both English and first languages via Zoom, in-person at community events, and at various workplaces.

In collaboration with Action Dignity and CCIS, our health and wellness team members have called to check on clients to address vaccine hesitation, respond to questions, assist in vaccine uptake (making referrals and/or informing clients of walk-in clinics).

AIMGA's health and wellness teams have had to remain up-to-date with evidence-based information on COVID-19 vaccines, latest findings, and changing regulations in order to keep community informed. Our health and wellness team continues to meet on Friday mornings from 9:30-10:30am.
