Pathologist Assistant

Overview	A pathologist assistant prepare for autopsies by obtaining patients' medical records and arranging for radiographic examinations. They also assist with or perform autopsies and surgical specimen examinations under pathologists' supervision. They dissects, examines, weighs and photographs organs and specimens, collects tissue samples for chemical analysis and record findings. Pathologist assistants are also responsible for discarding specimens according to established safety procedures. Cleaning and maintaining dissection, microscopes, and other instruments and equipment is also their responsibilities. Learn more

Notes/Other Information

Pathology assistants may need to work long time sitting or standing. They are required to be diligent and often need prolonged visual focus and repetitive motions.

There is risk of being exposed to strong chemicals, biological hazards, infectious diseases and the potential for needle prick injuries. They need to be extremely cautious and careful to follow laboratory safety procedures to be safe from contracting infection, and ensure the safety of patients and coworkers, Pathology assistants practise safe work procedures.

They may work full-time or part-time hours or on a call-in (casual) basis.

This is currently regulated but employers generally prefer certification from Canadian Certification Council of Pathologists' Assistants (CCCPA).

Difference between Autopsy Assistant/Morgue Technicians and Pathology Assistant

Pathology assistants generally work in hospital laboratories, private research labs and teaching facilities, according to the <u>AAPA</u>. They also work in morgue settings, especially when they assist forensic pathologist where they may work with organs and tissues of dead bodies. Morgue technicians/Autopsy Assistants work in hospital and city morgues. While Pathology Assistants are required to have college/university degrees, morgue technicians/autopsy assistants generally only need a high school or equivalent diploma. The salaries between the two professions also differ greatly. Pathologists' assistants earn an average yearly salary of \$69,854, according to <u>Neuvoo</u>. According to Canada's National Occupational Classification (NOC) system autopsy assistants/morgue technicians are classified as 'Other assisting occupations in support of health services (3414)', while pathology assistants are classified as 'Medical laboratory technicians and pathologists' assistants (3212)'. The average salary for autopsy assistants is listed at \$44,989 per year.

Steps towards capacity building to become competitive for this job

- 1. Get admitted into Master's program for Pathology Assistant program. The admission into some universities maybe competitive.
- 2. Certification from the <u>Canadian Certification Council of Pathologists'</u> Assistants (CCCPA).
- 3. Getting admission into the Master's program may be challenging as they are highly competitive. However, taking some open courses related to laboratory technology may facilitate the admission. For
